## Site Description

Brockwell Park is a large parkland area. The land is on a slight gradient running uphill from the North East entrance of the park to the South West corner. There are various hardstanding pathways throughout the park.

## Access Facilities

- **PA Ticket Scheme**

We provide a PA ticket scheme for individuals who would be unable to attend our events without bringing a personal assistant. Once you have bought a full price ticket, please fill in the online Access Request Form and provide us with a form of evidence as listed on the form in order to receive your personal assistant ticket.

- **Viewing Platform Access**

A viewing platform with a stewarded accessible toilet is located in front of the Main Stage. In order to gain access to the viewing platform, you need a viewing platform wristband. This also comes with a lanyard that can be worn by a personal assistant or companion so that they can join you on the platform.

- **Access Parking**

Parking at the park is limited, however we are working on trying to source some parking provision dedicated to access guests. Please check back for updates.

- **Accessible Toilets**

There will be a stewarded accessible toilet located beside the viewing platform at the Main Stage. A viewing platform wristband is required to gain access to this toilet. There will be other non-stewarded accessible toilets at every toilet block throughout the festival.

- **Assistance Dogs**

We welcome assistance dogs onto the site. There will be an area provided for toileting and drinking.

- **Strobe Lighting**

There will be general warning signs around the Main Arena if strobe lighting will be used. Due to the nature of the artists it is likely that strobe lighting will be used throughout the performances. There will not be a warning immediately before a period of strobe lighting.

- **Medical Services**

There will be a First Aid tent located in the Main Arena. There will also be Medics and First Aiders on patrol around the event. Please let us know in advance if you will be wishing to store medication so we can make the appropriate arrangements. If you require more information, please get in touch.

- **Hearing Loops**

We have hearing loops on site; these are available at the main entrance box office and the access reception.

- **British Sign Language**

We will try to provide a BSL service if requested, however in order to do so this need's requesting in advance. Please notify us of this by via the Access Request Form.

## **Travel Guide**

To get to Brockwell Park by tube, take the Victoria Line to Brixton tube station. You can always check out the Transport for London Journey Planner at [journeyplanner.tfl.gov.uk](http://journeyplanner.tfl.gov.uk) to help plan your journey.

The nearest Tube stations to Brockwell Park are: Brixton Tube Station (12 mins from Brockwell Park) and Clapham North Tube Station (22 mins from Brockwell Park).

The nearest Overground station is Herne Hill.
